Introduction: Turkey's Early election on June 24, 2018

President Erdogan, after a very short meeting with Devlet Bahçeli, the leader of Nationalist Movement Party (MHP), surprisingly made a call for an early election recently. It was just a few days ago when Mr. Bahçeli had made an astonishing announcement while he proposed the elections to be organized almost one year earlier than the planned time of 2019. It was indeed a fact that the main opposition party Republican People's Party (CHP) and the newly formed rightwing nationalist IYI (Good) Party had been making calls for an early election which was then heavily criticized by the President. The rationale of these two in their offer was the so-called "worsening" economic conditions and "adverse" security developments especially with regards to Syria. Now the opposition front seems happy although they claim that the decision was the part of a "carefully choreographed scenario" to take the political rivals by surprise. However, they have also been voicing series worries on the openness, freeness and fairness of the electoral process.

DRK considers that, although President Erdogan still remains the most powerful candidate for the future presidency, the opposition front also seems to have been more solidified than ever for this elections. As such, DRK foresees that the electoral process may witness an increase of the tensions in the political and security environment of Turkey. It is also confidently foreseeable by DRK that, current stability may prevail rather upon an election result on the benefit of Erdogan at least in the short term.

That being said, a potential negative result for President Erdogan may result in further changes far beyond the change of the name of the President and that of the balance within the Parliament in Turkey' future.

TANAP to start delivering gas in June: The Trans Anatolian Natural Gas Pipeline (TANAP) will start to operate at the end of June, General Manager Saltuk Düzyol said. TANAP, running from the eastern province of Ardahan on the border with Georgia towards borders with Greece and Bulgaria, is the central and longest section of the Southern Gas Corridor (SGC). The main aim of SGC is to connect the giant Shah Deniz gas field in Azerbaijan to Europe through the South Caucasus Pipeline (SCP), TANAP, and the Trans Adriatic Pipeline (TAP).



How to Manage the Risks and Protect Oil and Gas Infrastructures

The protection dimension of the energy infrastructure needs a coherent and holistic security strategy. Mechanical approaches like using CCTV, balloons, drones, fences, barriers may have a critical role in security nevertheless they could sometimes remain limited and could be easily disabled. On the other hand, responding the non-traditional and hybrid threats by employing the traditional security measures is very difficult, and a new security mindset for the energy industry is required. In this regard, in responding these unconventional threats, the solution should not be solely technical, social tactics should be included in a multilayered protection approach. For example, partnering with all stakeholders and recognizing the requirements and characteristics of local communities as well as implementing some social projects could give a tactical advantage for defenders.

Conducting a threat assessment and risk and business impact analysis seems to be a pre-condition in securing the critical assets where multiple scenario-based and Business Continuity Management approaches could have a crucial role in the development of the strategic security plans.
